



The School District of West De Pere has long been recognized as one of the top performing school districts in Northeast Wisconsin. The results from the State of Wisconsin School Report Cards continued to show that as a district, students in West De Pere Exceed Expectations based on state benchmarks. Additionally, each of the schools achieved a rating of Exceeds Expectations. This ranking is a testament to our staff, students, and parents.


Rankings on the State Report Card is one way to measure our district's success. Another way is by the number of curricular and extra curricular opportunities our students have access to during their time in West De Pere. Over the last number of years, the district has made a commitment to increase the number of Advanced Placement and College Credit Courses at the High School. Additionally, the district and taxpayers have generously supported student learning by providing facilities that are modern and innovative learning spaces.

One of the areas that is in need of attention is the technology education department located at the high school. While many renovations have been made to the high school, the technology education department has been largely untouched since 1969. Over the past number of years, student interest in technology education related to the trades as well as engineering has dramatically increased. Given the increased enrollment in courses, the technology department no longer has the physical capacity to offer a robust offering of courses that allow students who are interested in the trades to receive the education or experience they need to be career ready.

On April 1, 2025 the School District will be asking taxpayers to support a \$9.9 million referendum to expand and modernize the technology education area at the high school. If passed there will be no impact on the current mil rate of 7.04. Because of the increased value of property in the District, it is likely taxes will increase. Those increases are not related to this referendum but the result of the increased value of homes and businesses in the area.

Our students who are interested in attending post-secondary education have multiple options to get a head start by earning credits through Advanced Placement Courses and College Credit Courses. Students interested in a career in the trades will be granted the same opportunity to get a head start by learning skills that will help them secure jobs with local businesses.

April 2025: School District of West De Pere Referendum

During the November School Board meeting, the School Board unanimously approved a resolution to pursue a referendum in April of 2025. The \$9.925 million referendum will fund improvements to the high school's Technology Education department.

The existing facility is insufficient to meet the growing demand for course offerings for students as the current wood shop, auto shop, and metal shop have been untouched since they were built in 1969. Since the 2018-2019 school year, course requests have increased from 457 requests to 642 requests. Given our students' interest to explore classes and careers in the trades, it is our responsibility to ensure they have an appropriate instructional space to be career ready. Here are some of the goals that the district has for the referendum:

- Add shop space so we can:
 - Run the West De Pere Occupational Research X-ploration (W.O.R.X) courses year round
 - Develop additional Level 2 courses
 - Meet the needs of students interested in the trades
 - Spark the interest of students in the trades
- Create a flexible automotive and technology lab that would allow for vehicle service training and instruction in repairing small engines as well as in the Power Sports courses
- Improve shop safety for the West De Pere Occupational Research X-ploration (W.O.R.X) courses, the Car Care courses, and the Residential Design and Construction courses

If the referendum passes, the School District of West De Pere is committed to hold our current mill rate of \$7.04. As property values increase and other external factors cause increases, your taxes may increase regardless of the referendum results. Our commitment as a school district is to not increase our current mill rate of \$7.04.



Assumptions: The mill rate is also dependent on individual municipalities (this can be affected by several factors in which the School District of West De Pere has no control). The mill rate is based on the current 2025 Equalized Valuation of \$3,569,355,425.

These students demonstrated strong academic abilities on the PSAT test last school year and share this honor with only 16,000 other students nationwide.

They will now have the opportunity to compete for finalist status before final consideration to earn one of the 6,870 National Merit Scholarships totaling nearly \$26 million offered next spring. This is an achievement that only 1.25 percent of the top test takers in the nation achieve.






The West De Pere Varsity Dance Team held a dance clinic this past summer. The clinic was open to students 4K-8th grade and included a performance at the home varsity football game!



School District of West De Pere Annual Asbestos Notification

This notice has been written to comply with the Federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) regulations requireing yearly notification of asbestos activities within the School District of West De Pere.

An Asbestos Management Plan was developed in 1988 and has been continually maintained and upated since that time. The Management Plan is available to anyone for viewing during normal business hours by appointment only, when such appointment is made with the designated person at least one working day in advance.

Abatement of asbestos containing building materials is performed when necessary by accredited persons prior to disturbance during scheduled renovation or construction projects.

Any future asbestos activites will again be published along with the annual written notice.


