The High School Music Department presented concerts as part of their annual Fine Arts Night. 12 graduating seniors were recognized.



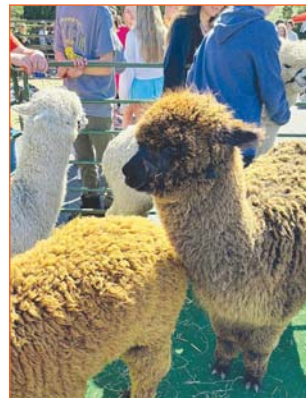
Thanks to the De Pere Health Department for their generous donation!

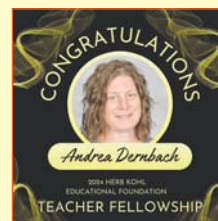

PERFECT ACT SCORE

High School student David Whipp, son of Lee and Angela Whipp, has earned the highest possible ACT composite score of 36. Achieving a perfect ACT score is very rare. Only 3,376 out of more than 1.34 million students earned a top composite score of 36, which is only .002% of all test takers.



Along with his academic achievements, David is an AP Scholar of Distinction, Badger Boys State Leadership Program, and all conference Math team. He is also a nationally ranked chess player. David participates in Cross Country as a Boys Team Captain, National Honor Society Secretary, Student Council, Founder and President of the high school Computer Science Club and recently was a DECA 2024 International Silver Medallion recipient in Financial Services Team Decision Making. Whipp is a volunteer for Brown County Library Summer Reading Program and also volunteers as a Chess tournament director at local schools.

Whipp will have earned 47 credits for college through College Credit Courses and/or Advanced Placement testing during his West De Pere High School career. David plans on attending college and studying computer science after high school.

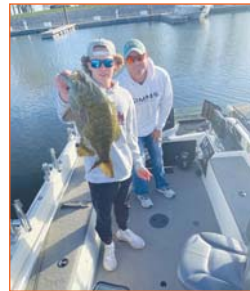




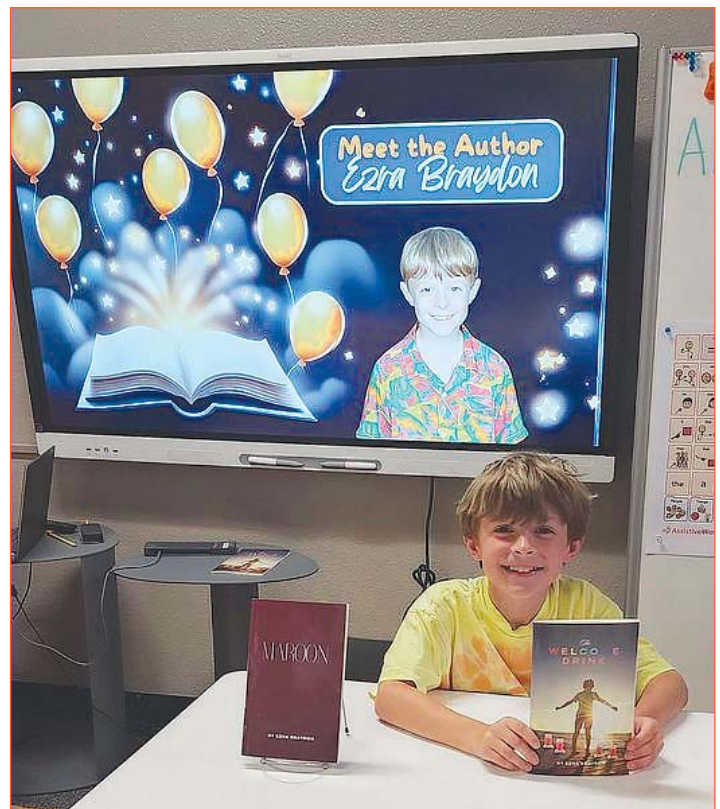
We had some of our *brightest* teachers sporting some shades at the Wisconsin Math Council Annual Conference in Green Lake in May.

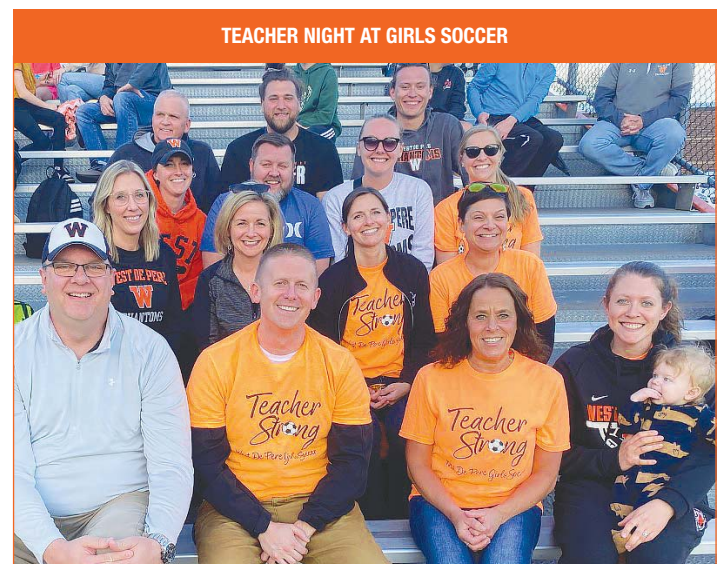

Overcoming Osteosarcoma to Excel

Daniel Nehls, a sophomore at West De Pere High School, has truly overcome and not allowed obstacles to prevent him from his goals of becoming a successful athlete.

Daniel was diagnosed with Osteosarcoma on January 1, 2020. He woke up one day with pain in his legs, so his parents brought him to the doctor. It was initially identified as muscle cramps or growing pains, but the pain persisted, so Daniel's parents brought him in for a second opinion. After further testing, Daniel received the diagnosis.

While Daniel has completed chemotherapy, he has undergone 6 surgeries that have impacted his ability to participate in athletics. He will have his seventh surgery this summer, and has bone scans every three months to ensure the cancer has not returned.

As an active and athletic person, Daniel has truly persevered and found a way to still be active in sports. Right now, he's an active member of West De Pere's track and field team. He races in a specialized chair against



other athletes who also use race chairs for track events, and uses specialized equipment to participate in field events such as shot put. While the field of competitors is currently small, Daniel hopes that his participation and goal to raise awareness increases inclusion and encourages participation for students who need adaptive equipment for racing.

Daniel is thankful to have track and field as a sport, as he's not able to participate much in football anymore due to his surgeries. When told that he's an inspiration, Daniel replied, "Anyone can be inspiring. What you do with what you have, makes you inspiring."

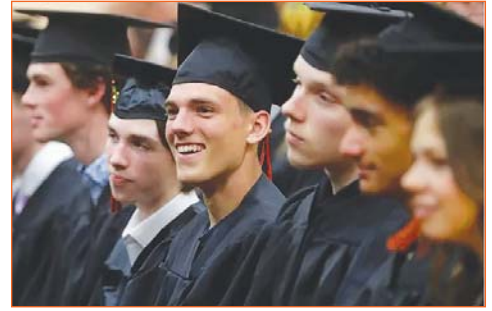

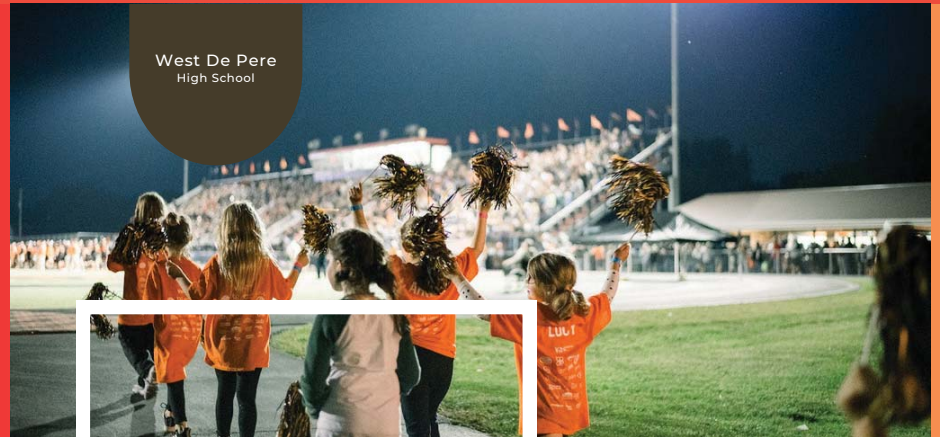

Pre-School Developmental Screening

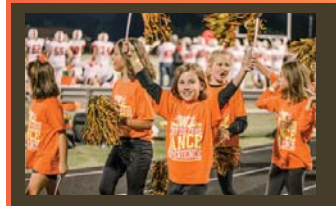
